Points for Prayer

This is **Holy Week**. We will use scripture to pray through the last days before Jesus Crucifixion.

Monday 3rd April

After the events of **Palm Sunday** Jesus went back into the city of Jerusalem on the **Monday**. It was during this visit the Jewish leaders began to question his authority. **(Read Mark 11: 27-33)** Pray that we as individuals and as a church would recognise and submit to Jesus' authority.

Tuesday 4th April

The **Tuesday** of Holy Week was the last day in which Jesus openly taught in the temple and in the city. John in his gospel tells us that many, including some of the leaders, believed in him but would not openly say so because of fear of the pharisees. (**Read John 12: 37-50**) Pray for a willingness and boldness to openly confess Jesus this Easter.

Wednesday 5th April

On the **Wednesday** of Holy Week **Mary** broke open her bottle of expensive perfume and anointed Jesus' feet in the house of **Simon the Leper** (**Read Matthew 26: 6-16**). Consider ways in which we can give that same type of worship to Jesus. What is today's equivalent of anointing Jesus' feet? Ask God to reveal how we should be worshiping him.

Thursday 6th April

Maundy Thursday is the day when Jesus washed the disciples' feet and celebrated the last supper with his disciples. (**John 13: 1-17**) Jesus told his disciples *Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet*. How can we serve our neighbours? Pray that we would have the same servant's heart as Jesus and so follow his example.

Friday 7th April

(Read Luke 23: 26-43) Jesus said, 'Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.' This is Good Friday. There is much to celebrate, we are forgiven, our debt is paid, the curtain is torn, and we are united with our Father in heaven. Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say rejoice!

Saturday 8th April

Saturday, the forgotten day. The Chief priests remembered Jesus promise to rise from the dead on the third day and so they asked for the tomb to be guarded. (**Matthew 26: 62-66**) Thank God for the certainty that Jesus did die for us. The price is paid, death is conquered!

Sunday 9th April

He is not here, he has risen! Read Matthew 28: 1-10 and rejoice in the empty tomb! Jesus Christ is Risen Today!
