

Points for Prayer

Sunday 28th April

This morning as we gather as a church community thank God for the fellowship and support we have in one another and pray for those who are unable to get out this morning because of illness or infirmity.

Monday 29th April

The war in Ukraine continues to grind on with countless thousands being killed, injured or displaced. Billions of dollars are being spent on the instruments of war and the region remains braced for the conflict spreading as NATO increases its presence in neighbouring member countries. Pray for the people of Ukraine, its leaders and supporters around the globe. Pray for an end to Russian aggression and a just peace that protects the people of Ukraine.

Tuesday 30th April

The war in Gaza brings untold suffering to so many innocent lives. The discovery of mass graves in the Nasser and al-Shifa hospitals is distressing. The whole region is incredibly uneasy as Israel and Iran engage in a dangerous stand off as well as the ongoing skirmishes on the Lebanese border. Pray for a workable peace in the area and an easing of tensions.

Wednesday 1st May

Every day people are being loaded into small boats to make the dangerous journey across the channel from France to England. Last week we heard of one boat getting into difficulty resulting in 5 deaths including a girl of 7 years old. Pray for a workable solution to this crisis that protects those who are running for their lives. Pray that the

gangs who traffic across not just the Channel, but many dangerous waters would be disrupted and discouraged.

Thursday 2nd May

Children with special educational needs continue to find it difficult to get a suitable place in primary schools in Northern Ireland. Pray for the education minister Paul Givan MLA as he works with the department and head teachers in an attempt to solve this problem.

Friday 3rd May

The Police Service of Northern Ireland continues face significant challenges while trying to deliver an effective policing service. Pray for the Chief Constable Jon Boutcher as well as the local district commanders. Pray that government ministers would provide the budget for increased recruitment that would enable more effective policing.

Saturday 4th May

As the devolved governments across the UK seem to step back from agreed climate change targets, pray for a sensible and effective approach to climate change that helps to protect some of the poorest people across the globe who are most affected by extreme shifts in climate.
