

Points for Prayer

Sunday 30th June

This morning, we are thinking about how God's grace is displayed in our lives through the discipline of reading our bibles and prayer. Take time to reflect on how often we read and pray. Do we simply read some verse and move on or do we take time to allow God's word to *dwell in us richly* (Colossians 3:16) Why not take time to dwell on a piece of scripture today.

Monday 1st July

Jesus said that he came to proclaim the good news to the poor, freedom for the prisoner, recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free and proclaim the year of the Lord's favour. Take time to slowly read and think about **Luke 4: 18-19**. In what way does this passage apply to our life. Ask God to work in our life just as Jesus said he would.

Tuesday 2nd July

In **Colossians 3:1** we are encouraged to set our eyes on things above because that is where Christ is seated. Take time to read Colossians 3. What are the ways in which we can set our minds on things above. Ask God to teach us how to keep our mind on things above.

Wednesday 3rd July

In **Amos 5:5** God implores us to seek him and not any other. What are the ways in which we seek after other gods. Repentance is part of the Christian life, take time to come before God seeking to turn away from those other gods. Ask that he would show us how to put our trust in him.

Thursday 4th July

Proverbs 15:22 teaches that plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisors they succeed. On election day reflect on this. Which MP's can we elect who give wise counsel to a new government. Take time to pray before voting today, bring each manifesto before the Lord and vote as he directs.

Friday 5th July

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people – for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. **1 Timothy 2:1-2**. We have elected a new government today. Pray for that government. Ask God in what ways we should be praying, ask how we should be supporting those in authority and then faithfully commit to pray.

Saturday 6th June

In **1 Peter 3:8-9** we are encouraged to be like-minded, sympathetic, love one another, not to repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing because we are called to be a blessing. Take time to read these verses and to reflect. How can we be a blessing within our church family and the wider community. Pray for those relationships where it is difficult to be blessing because those relationships are fraught. Ask that God would be at work in us enabling us to be gracious and forgiving, a blessing.
